The ESO is recruiting for a Visceral Osteopathy lecturer to teach across 3 years of the MOST programme from September 2017. Years 3 and 4 of the programme remain on the existing curriculum and receive 30 and 12 hours of teaching respectively. Year 1 students will receive an introduction to Visceral as part of the new curriculum validated by Buckinghamshire New University beginning in September 2017.

The successful candidate will have a PGCertHE or similar qualification and experience of teaching Visceral Osteopathy.

Visceral osteopathy has traditionally been an important part of the osteopathic curriculum at the ESO. It will assume a greater importance in the new curriculum which emphasises a holistic approach to the body in function and dysfunction. Visceral concepts and approaches will form an important and routine part of evaluation, diagnosis and treatment of clinic patients in accordance with our values statement.

A visceral lecturer is required who can promote high levels of student visceral conceptual and clinical competence within a total integrative approach to patients. He/She will also use Visceral Osteopathy as a treatment modality in practice
