

Health and Safety General Policy

We at the European School of Osteopathy recognize our duties under the Health and Safety at Work etc Act 1974 and the accompanying protective legislation. We will endeavor to meet the requirements of this legislation so as to ensure that we maintain a safe and healthy working environment. Our managers and supervisory staff are informed of their responsibilities to ensure they take all reasonable precautions, to ensure the safety, health and welfare of those that are likely to be affected by our undertaking.

European School of Osteopathy recognizes so far as is reasonably practicable the duty to ensure the following:

- To provide and maintain a safe place of work, safe systems of work, safe equipment and a healthy and safe working environment.
