

Canine level II Module 0 (pre-requisite) CPD course 2020

<p>Workshop</p>	<p>Dates: 20th/21st October 2020 9.30-16.30 daily 14 hours CPD</p> <p>This is the pre-requisite module for the Level II Osteopathic Approach to the canine patient course, allowing you to develop your osteopathic skills for the canine patient, continuing on from the level I/Foundation course and is a prerequisite to our other level III workshops. Module 0 comprises of a mixture of theory and practical elements over 2 days.</p> <p>The aim of this module is to ensure students are ready to develop their osteopathic assessment and practical skills throughout the level II course.</p> <p>The Level II Osteopathic Approach to the canine patient course runs over a total of 20 days with modules which can be taken in succession or chosen from as required. The aim of the course is to offer practitioners a deeper knowledge to support and develop their animal practice. Successful completion and comprehension of the content will give practitioners all they need to enter our Stage III workshops with confidence.</p>
<p>Award</p>	<p>Those who successfully complete the 2-day workshop will be awarded an AOI/ESO CPD Certificate of Attendance: Osteopathic concepts in canine practice and the Fundamentals of Canine Musculoskeletal Assessment and Technique (soft tissue, stretching and articulation)</p> <p>Those who successfully complete all Level II Modules (0-6 inclusive) will receive an AOI/ESO Certificate of Osteopathic approach to the canine patient - Level II</p>
<p>Open to</p>	<p>This course is mainly intended for canine osteopaths & equine/veterinary professionals. All delegates should provide evidence of insurance, which allows them to study/work on/with animals.</p>

<p>Pre-requisite</p>	<p>Experience handling dogs Equivalent of the AOI's level 1 osteopathic approach to the canine patient or ESO Foundation canine course Background in canine manual therapy</p>

<p>Course content</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Adaptations of core osteopathic principles and concepts to enhance your canine practice • Adaptations of osteopathic models of to enhance your approach to canine practice • Application of these principles/concepts and their importance to enhance your canine case history taking • How to utilise these concepts and models to enhance your creation of high quality and effective treatment and management protocols • MSK case based application of these concepts, principles and models. • Increase your confidence and efficacy • Refresher of forelimb, hindlimb and spinal assessment, muscle palpation and joint testing to enhance your assessment of the canine patient • Refresher of the application of soft tissue techniques to enhance your treatment of canine musculature • Review of stretching and articulation of the canine limbs and spine to enhance your treatment of the canine patient • High practical content with demonstrations and practical • Low student to dog ratio (1 between every 2-3 students) • Low tutor to student ratio (maximum 1:6 students)

Note	<p>Dogs:</p> <p>Although sufficient canine models will be available to meet the needs of each class, to maximise the learning experience students are, where logistically possible, encouraged to bring a well-behaved dog with them. This would include dogs that are happy to be handled and be in the same room as other dogs. All dogs should have their own insurance.</p> <p>Notes:</p> <p>Please note that minimum numbers will be required in order to run this course. If minimum numbers are not met the AOI reserves the right to cancel the course. If for any reason, AOI has to cancel the course, (either due to inadequate numbers, adverse weather conditions or failure on the behalf of our third-party facilities), you will be refunded in full.
