

Equine level II Module 3 Balanced Ligamentous Tension (BLT) and Balanced Tissue Tension (BTT) - engaging the body through the soft tissues CPD course 2020

Workshop

Dates: 19th/30th September and 27th/28th October 2020 (4 days)

Timetable: 9.30-16.30 hrs each day.

Number of CPD hours: 28 hours

This is module 3 of the Level II Osteopathic Approach to the equine patient course, allowing you to develop your osteopathic skills for the equine patient, continuing on from the level I/Foundation course. This module looks at balanced ligamentous and tissue techniques, to engage the body in treatment through soft tissue structures and comprises of a mixture of theory and practical elements over 4 days

The aim of this module is to ensure students are skilled in the application of balanced ligamentous and tissue tension techniques, and enhancing palpation to enable the determination of structures and layers within the equine patient. Improve your skills and abilities in applying direct and indirect techniques to work with the horse's body, enhancing the assimilation of treatment. Create finesse in finding functional restrictions and assessing quality of movement within the soft tissues, determine in which layer the dysfunction is primarily situated, enhance your efficacy of treatment and learn to treat horses who require a more 'sensitive' approach. Suitable for all horses but especially young and older horses where alternative techniques are not always suitable.

The Level II Osteopathic Approach to the equine patient course runs over modules 1-6 with a pre-requisite module 0 (a total of 20 days). Modules can be taken in succession or chosen from as required. The aim of the course is to offer practitioners a deeper knowledge to support and develop their animal practice. Successful completion and comprehension of the content will give practitioners all they need to enter our Stage III workshops with confidence.

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| <p>Course content</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Grounding - how to stay grounded whilst the horse around you moves, • How to engage with your equine patient but not intrude • Layer palpation, how to determine in which layer the dysfunction originates • Testing dysfunction using subtle tissue tension • Which dysfunction is the main influencer? - subtle assessment to support effective treatment • History of and current theories and understanding of BLT/BTT • Application of BLT and BTT techniques to the equine patient • High practical content with demonstrations and practical • Low student to horse ratio (1 between every 2-3 students) • Low tutor to student ratio (maximum 1:6 students) |
