

Equine level II Module 4 Mobilisation Adjustments and Toggles CPD course 2020

Workshop

Dates: 8th/9th November and 15th/16th December 2020 (4 days)

Timetable: 9.30-16.30 hrs each day.

Number of CPD hours: 28 hours

This is module 4 of the Level II Osteopathic Approach to the Equine patient course, allowing you to develop your osteopathic skills for the Equine patient, continuing on from the level I/Foundation course. This module looks at mobilisation adjustments and toggles, to engage the body in treatment through joints and neurological reflex arcs and comprises of a mixture of theory and practical elements over 4 days

The aim of this module is to ensure students are skilled in the application of mobilisation adjustments and toggle techniques, enhancing palpation to enable the determination of joint lines and effective technique application inside the 'safe zone' within the Equine patient. Improve your skills and abilities in applying mobilisation adjustment and toggle techniques to work with the horse's body, enhancing the assimilation of treatment. Create finesse in finding the restrictive barrier to enable effective technique whilst working with the horse rather than needing to fight. This module will enhance your efficacy of treatment and open the range of horses you can apply these techniques to, learn to be accurate and use finesse rather than force, in order to be able to apply techniques to a whole spectrum of Equine patients, young and old.

The Level II Osteopathic Approach to the Equine patient course runs over modules 1-6 with a pre-requisite module 0 (a total of 20 days). Modules can be taken in succession or chosen from as required. The aim of the course is to offer practitioners a deeper knowledge to support and develop their animal practice. Successful completion and comprehension of the content will give practitioners all they need to enter our Stage III workshops with confidence.
