

Equine level II Module 5 General Health Screening and Functional Neurology CPD course 2021

Workshop

Dates: 23rd/24th March and 13th/14th April 2021 (4 days)

Timetable: 9.30-16.30 hrs each day.

Number of CPD hours: 28 hours

This is module 5 of the Level II Osteopathic Approach to the equine patient course, allowing you to develop your osteopathic skills for the equine patient, continuing on from the level I/Foundation course. This module looks at General Health Screening and Functional Neurology relating to your equine patient and comprises of a mixture of theory and practical elements over 4 days

The aim of this module is to ensure students are skilled in the screening of their equine patients prior to undertaking treatment. Learn how to screen the horse's systems, and look for signs of systemic ill health. Understand the equine neurological system and how to assess both central and peripheral issues. Localise lesions and determine whether the horse is safe to treat. Is the problem a functional musculoskeletal issue or is there a deeper cause? Enhance your clinical differentials and safety, ensuring equine welfare, be able to quickly and skilfully determine the area of dysfunction and refer as required. This module will enhance your safety and clinical assessment skills standing you apart from the crowd.

The Level II Osteopathic Approach to the equine patient course runs over modules 1-6 with a pre-requisite module 0 (a total of 20 days). Modules can be taken in succession or chosen from as required. The aim of the course is to offer practitioners a deeper knowledge to support and develop their animal practice. Successful completion and comprehension of the content will give practitioners all they need to enter our Stage III workshops with confidence.
